Place it is a set of two tables, a stool, a two-children bench, and a set of 10 different modules.

The tables, the stool, and the bench are designed to hold the modules.

The modules have different shapes and can be easily placed on the slots. The modules are designed to rock freely to explore movement and balance.

Some of them can be reached and used both from under and above.

The modules can also be used as drawing templates.

The tables, the stool, and the bench are set at two heights to guarantee good access for children aged 3 to 8 years.
